Edinburgh

GT: We've had a problem with the venue. We've asked for C Nova and they can't provide it to us. C Venues want Ordinary Days to perform in C Too, slightly bigger venue at 8:30pm rather than C Nova at 10pm, same price w/ Tech Operator. The bigger space will jeopardise the original directorial blocking.

GT: We're Disappointed but there's not much we can do. We're thinking of reserving chairs at the back to 'enforce' an intimacy on people.

No more reviewers sneaking away at the back-left corner. They too will become part of the vegetable garden.

CL: It's a known show which could sell better than Nova's seating would provide. It won't sell out but it's better for C Venues if we sell more tickets. Get In/Get out is still charged at £10 per minute overrun. Moving forward we have to look at backup options for next year, such as The Space, because the venue should be accommodated to the vision and we've been pushed around by C Venues.

Freelancers

Aidan Pittman enters the fray.

AP: Freelancers is going well now that everyone's back and we have a heavily scheduled week due to the minefield of the shows of the past couple of weeks. Worried about the situation of radio microphones. We haven't got any sound organised and we don't want to lose the lyrics with a dominating band.

JB: Drums aren't going to be mic'd or behind a screen, and as a result you can't really control their levels.

Aidan and Gem will talk to StageSoc about Curtains staying up after Comedy Fridge for sound purposes.

The Holi Festival which has been playing since midday on Red Brick has now turned from Walk The Moon to Beyonce. Hartley Library must be thrilled.

MEGA-PITCHES

GT: We think the Nuffield slot is provisionally booked for either the 6th-11th February, or 13th-18th February. This shouldn't change anything since we ideally should have an Annex slot in February and then another in March.

LE: We can't have people putting effort into a main pitch if it's held immediately after Nuffield pitches.

CT: An option would be emergency pitches in September, if we can?

JM: The main problem is it will affect pitch teams if we don't do it early enough, maybe we wait for PA Nuffield Pitches first, and if we don't get it, we do main pitches at the same time?

PA Nuffield Pitches are (assumed) on the 1st June and there will be Showstoppers' pre-pitches in the evening of Friday 27th May, written pitches in on the Sunday prior. If nobody pitches for Nuffield on behalf of Showstoppers then Main Show will also be pitched at the MEGA-PITCHES event.

Pitches for Freshers, Small and possibly Main will be held on Wednesday 8th June with written pitches due on the 5th June. If Nuffield is pitched successfully, there will be no main pitches.

CL has introduced the 'Speaking Lanyard', nobody can talk without it. Unfortunately this does not affect my need to minute committee.

Treasurer

AM: We have funding for a keyboard.

JB: We have two options, either go for a new keyboard or one which we can specifically use in shows?

LE: What if the one we have breaks down again (which is likely).

AM: I think it would be best to invest in a new keyboard which is suitable for both rehearsals and shows.
